Dear Honorable President Elias,

On March 5, 2024, the voters approved Proposition E (“Prop E”), an initiative ordinance requiring the Commission and the Police Department to engage in a community engagement process before the Commission may agendize “any proposal to establish, modify, or abolish policies or procedures related to Department operations.” (Admin. Code § 96I.1(a).) The community engagement process is intended to help the Commission and Department receive public feedback on whether proposed changes to policies and procedures governing Department operations will impact the Department’s ability to efficiently and effectively serve the community. The purpose of this process is to “describe the existing policies and procedures,” “solicit feedback on their implementation and impacts,” and “identify possible changes” rather than to consider or advocate for specific draft proposals. Prop E allows the Chief of Police to waive the community engagement process provided that certain conditions are met.

The Chief of Police hereby waives the community engagement process based on:

- The proposed changes are unlikely to have a substantial impact on the Department’s ability to serve the community
- The amount of public feedback already received on the subject matter
- The need for immediate action
- Other factors as the Chief may deem appropriate
